- 3. What could "commit your soul to the faithful creator and do good" (vs. 19) mean in light of the context of verses 16 to 19? Let's read and discuss.



For Reflection:

- 1. When do you discover that you are more joyful:
- a) When you serve serve you?
- b) When you focus on others or when they others or in yourself?
- c) When you observe the circumstances or when you focus on eternal realities?
- 2. In what way could we as a cell this week make it more noticeable or more evident that the Spirit "rests on us"?
- 3. Seeing so much evil in this world, what kind of thoughts come to your mind?
- a) "No one will escape the judgment of God"
- b) "All the evil they do will be reversed sooner or later"
- c) "God has forgotten his creation"
- d) "God has entrusted me with the good news (gospel) to make it known"
- e) "May Christ delay his return a little bit so that more people know him"
- f) "other
