"At SEMILLA..."

1. - We do not emphasize HIERARCHIES..... (vs. 1)
2. - We know our TASK..... (vs. 2-4)
3. - We follow the LEADER..... (vs 5)

Objective: Recognize when the relationship between SEMILLA members is healthier and why..

Icebreaker:

What has been the task or job with the most responsibility you have had to do?

To Start:

1. - Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from last Sunday's teaching on "Semilla Online", 1 Peter 5:1-5.
2. - Let's review this week's memorization together and then two or three volunteers say our memory verses.

To Observe:

1. - Let's read verse 1 in various versions, and then let's discuss everything we learn from Peter in that little verse.
2. - Let's make two lists: everything a pastor should do and the other of everything he should not do, considering verses 2 to 4.
3. - What can we learn from verse 5 about relationships between church members?

For Reflection:

1.- Let's make an "affirmation circle"; each participant mentions a character trait of Jesus that he finds in the moderator, and so on, we affirm each participant in the same way.

2. - How has your example been a help or a hindrance when it comes to winning or discipling your children, your friends, the little sheep that God has placed under your care, etc.....? (The moderator makes sure that everyone understands the question)

3. - Among the SEMILLA family: Who is the person to whom you report, and who are some of the people who report to you?

1 Peter 5:1-3 New International Version

5 To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: ² Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; ³ not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock.
