

# Objective: Reflect on the true cost of discipleship.

### To Start:

- 1. Let's review our memory verses Matthew 16:15-16
- 2. Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from the teaching this weekend in Matthew 16:21-28.

### To Observe a little and think a little:

- 1. Why do you think it was necessary for Jesus to go to Jerusalem? Let's read verse 21 in a few different versions before sharing.
- 2. Let's read verses 23 and 24 in a couple of versions and then take a few minutes to paraphrase these same verses, once time is our we can all share.

- 3. In light of verses 24 to 26, what are the requirements to be a disciple of Jesus?
- 4. Finally, let's read verses 27 and 28 to discuss what draws our attention the most from these verses.

## To Reflect:

- 1. What has been the greatest paradox you have experienced? Are you currently learning to live in one? (The moderator explain and be the first to respond)
- 2. How necessary is it for you to learn to see things as God sees them?
- 3. If following Jesus means "denying yourself" do you consider yourself a follower of Jesus?)
- 4. In what area of brokenness and hopelessness do you need to "open" your eyes to see the kingdom of God?

Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?
