To Start:

- 2. Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from the teaching this weekend in Matthew 21:1-11.

1. Let's read verses 1 to 3 imagining that we are there in the middle of that conversation, What attracts your attention more than "what you see or hear"?

	Let's make a composition that describes Jesus' entry into Jerusalem using the best from Isaiah 62:11 and Zech 9:9 as well as verses 4-7.
	Which expressions in the people's reaction from verses 8 to 11 reflect the royalty of Jesus and, which ones reflect the humiliation of the "servant of Jehovah"? Let's read, nake two lists and share.
To ref	lect: If Jesus will need something, do you think he will ask you? Why or why not?
2. }	How do you know Jesus: As a servant or as a king? How do you need to know him?
