Matthew 20:29-34

"When Jesus Walked by Me..."

- 1) It seemed that I was looking for Him (vs 29-30)
- 2) He gave me faith to believe (v 31)
- 3) He made me know my true need (vs 32-33)
- 4) He had compassion on me (v 34)

Objective: *Reflect on the type of response we have had after being "touched" by Jesus.*

Icebreaker: Who is the most famous person you have been able to see up close? What were the circumstances?

To Start:

1. Let's review together the memory verse Matthew 20:25-28

2. Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from the teaching this weekend in Matthew 20:29-34.

To Observe a little and think a little:

1. Which of the details in the scene described in verses 29 and 30 stand out to you the most? Let's read the verses and share.

2. Why do you think Jesus did not respond to these blind men after their first cry?
Let's read verse 31 in a couple of versions before we share.
3. How do you think the Lord's question and the response of these blind men in verses 32
33 are related to each other? Let's read and share.
4. What did Jesus' compassion produce in these two blind men according to verse 34?

To Reflect

1. In what ways has adversity been, or has not been, a gift to your faith?
2. If Jesus asked you: "what do you want me to do to you", what would you answer?
3. What has "the touch of Jesus" produced in you: That you rest in your communion with God, that focus more on yourself, indifference to the "things of God", more faith, gratitude, desire to follow him, the determination to live only for him, other?

Ephesians 2:6-10 "6 And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, 7 in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.
