Message Outline

Icebreaker: If a photograph of yours were published on social media and went viral, how would you like to appear in the photograph?

To Start:

- 1. Let's review our memory verses together Romans 5:6-8
- 2. Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from this weekend's teaching on Matthew 14:13-21.

To Observe a little and think a little:

1. What thought does it produce in you when you see Jesus retreating to a deserted and lonely place to be interrupted by the crowd? (Let's read verses 13 and 14 and then talk)

- 2. What similarities and differences do you observe between Jesus and his disciples and their way of perceiving the need of the crowd? (Let's read verses 15 to 18 to talk)
- 3. To finish, let's read verses 19 to 21 and comment on what is most striking about the end of the story

To Reflect:

- 1. Do you consider being alone with Jesus every day a good idea, a necessity, a habit already developed, a hindrance, something you hadn't thought of, something else?
- 2. What do you think could be the benefits of having a daily appointment alone with Jesus?
- 3. What would you say is more your style of ministry: see a need and go ask for help? See a need and pray, nothing more? or See a need and meet it?
- 4. How would you say you express your faith in the power of God?
